AP Capstone Application Process

Overview

All Students may apply from the Class of 2020

Applications are submitted online.

Students must have teachers submit recommendations online. Students can have two recommendations. They must have at least one recommendation from a teacher in an academic content area.

Students must also submit a parental permission form to participate in the application process with the understanding that acceptance to the AP Capstone program will commit the student for the next two years. Parents are also signing that they are willing to submit their child to the admission process outlined below.

There are 60 seats for this program

The application consists of four equally weighted parts:

- o PSAT Score
- o GPA
- Interview
 - Documentation, in the form of rubrics, will be completed for each interview. All interview questions and rubrics will be shared with students and parents in advance. All students will have the same interview questions. Only follow up questions will differ from student to student. Interviews will consist of five panelists. Teachers, who have the student for one or more classes, will recuse themselves from scoring and will only listen during the interview.
- o Teacher Recommendation
 - Students will solicit recommendations from two teachers (One must be from and academic subject area. Teacher recommendations are objective.)

In a case where a student does not have a PSAT Score, we will substitute an average of the scores generated from the other categories.

^{*}Students with extensive unexcused absences or tardies will not be considered

^{*}Students with an honor code violation will not be considered

^{*}Depending on the number of applicants, the school may make a cut score based on the combined weight of PSAT, GPA, and Teacher Recommendation before the interview round.

^{*}All students, who do not have a PSAT score, will be guaranteed an interview.
