RISING KINDERGARTEN LITERACY PROGRAM (ELA)

This program is for students currently in the Pre-K 4-year-old program needing instruction in language and literacy in preparation for kindergarten. Instruction will be provided by preschool teachers who are trained in the Orton-Gillingham, multisensory approach to teaching language and literacy.

SPELL K-3 NEWCOMER MULTILINGUAL LEARNERS

ESL SUMMER ENRICHMENT (GRADES K-11)





MARINE CORPS JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICERS' TRAINING CORPS (MCJROTC)


The MCJROTC summer program is a voluntary Review & Refresher course designed for returning cadets, in order to:
