# FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

*The 2024-2025 school year will begin on Friday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024.* In order to help facilitate both a smooth and orderly mode of transition during the times of arrival and dismissal, please adhere to the following safety procedures:

# **Instructional Session Times:**

- School hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for students in Grades Kindergarten 8.
- School hours are from 8:20 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for students in Pre-K and Self-contained Autism classes.
- The doors will open for students in Grades Kindergarten 8 at 7:00 a.m.



# <u>Arrival:</u>

- Students in Grades Pre-K 3 will enter through the Main Entrance.
- Students in Grades  $\frac{4-8}{4-8}$  will enter through the Side Entrance.

# **Dismissal:**

- Students in Grades Pre-K and Kindergarten will exit through the Main Entrance.
- Students in Grades 1 3 will exit through the Cafeteria.
- Students in Grades  $\frac{4-8}{4-8}$  will exit through the Side Entrance.

There will be staff members outside to assist everyone during the first week of school.

# POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS

PowerSchool is an electronic management system that is utilized by the Elizabeth Public Schools in order to collect, store, and maintain pertinent student data and records. The application provides parents with real-time access to information that pertains to a student's schedule, attendance, grades, and academic progress; it also offers a convenient and accommodating way for both parents and teachers to communicate as needed. Therefore, everyone stays connected. Schedules for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year will be available to view on PowerSchool on *Thursday, August 29th*.



# NEW AND RETURNING PARENTS TO EPS

Parents of new students must request a new account in order to input all of the information required to navigate the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Parents of existing students will need to log in, input, and update any changed information that has occurred for their child.

#### ELECTRONIC DEVICES

# Pre-K:

The implementation of iPads into the preschool classrooms provides an opportunity for our youngest students to extend their learning through developmentally appropriate active-learning experiences. While the iPad can serve as a tool to help reinforce skills in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics, it can also provide opportunities for preschool students to investigate, explore, and create within the early childhood setting.

The implementation of the iPad is integrated seamlessly into the preschool curriculum during center time. iPads enhance student learning by providing opportunities for students to retell and create their own stories, investigate and explore exciting new places and diverse cultures, capture their learning through student created portfolios, and reinforce skills through books and learning applications.

# <mark>K-8:</mark>

For the past few years, our school has operated as a 1:1 technology school; and as a result, all students will continue to utilize a *laptop computer* for their daily classroom instruction. Students should make every effort to take excellent care of their *laptops* throughout the school year, as this is a very special privilege. Our 1:1 technology implementation will continue to ensure that our students attain the competitive standards that are needed to foster both college and career readiness. *Students will be given their charger and laptops during the first day of school. Students who had summer school should bring their laptops and chargers with them. Students in grades K-5 will keep their laptops at school and students in grades 6-8 will be able to take them home.*

#### IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

# Pre-K:

Please be advised that the State of New Jersey, Department of Health Services, has changed several immunization requirements. All children attending licensed childcare centers and preschools are required to receive an annual flu vaccination.

Please provide proof of your child's required immunization as soon as possible and *no later than* **December 20<sup>th</sup>**, **2024.** Students who do not have the required documentation will be excluded from school as of **January 2<sup>nd</sup>**, **2025.** 

# <mark>K-8:</mark>

The state of New Jersey has mandated that all children born after January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1997 and enrolled in Grade Six, <u>will be required to receive a booster dose of the diphtheria, tetanus and</u> <u>pertussis vaccine (Tdap) as well as one dose of meningococcal vaccine</u>. Documentation that your child has received the required sixth grade immunizations must be turned into the school nurse no later than *Friday, September 6<sup>th</sup>*, 2024.

Students entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade with birthdays on or after *Friday, September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024* must provide written confirmation from your child's healthcare provider of the vaccination appointment. This appointment should be within two weeks of your child turning 11 years of age. The immunization record must be submitted immediately following the appointment. The Elizabeth Public School District is compelled by law to ensure that all students receive their required immunizations.

<u>Children who do not meet immunization requirements or do not have documentation of a</u> <u>scheduled appointment within two weeks of turning 11 years of age will be excluded from</u> <u>school beginning the first school day.</u>



### **TRANSPORTATION**

Transportation will be available for the following students:

- Elementary students who live more than 2.0 miles from their school
- High school students who live more than 2.5 miles from their school
- Students whose IEP include transportation services

#### SCHOOL SUPPLIES

# Pre-K:

On the first day of school, parents will receive letters from their child's teacher with specific classroom requirements. Here is a basic list of supplies that is highly suggested:

- 1 COMPLETE set of extra clothes (1 long sleeve shirt and 1 short sleeve shirt, pants, socks, and 2 pairs of underwear ALL items must be labeled with your child's name and placed in a large zip lock bag, with your child's name on the bag as well. These are back up clothes since Pre-K students are not required to be in uniform.)
- 1 NAP MATT labeled with your child's name on it (This item can be purchased at <u>Walmart</u> for around \$25 - it is the easiest to be washed and it fits on our beds easily. It will be sent home every week and will need to be returned on Mondays.)
- Box of Tissues
- Container of Disinfectant Wipes
- Container of Baby Wipes
- Box of Nitrile Gloves (Medium)
- 2 Family Photos and 2 Recent Photos of your child
- 1 Backpack large enough to fit your child's Nap Matt (*no mini backpacks*)
