FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL / ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

The 2024-2025 school year will begin on Friday, September 6th, 2024. Instruction will be conducted during the hours of 8:20 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. In order to help facilitate both a smooth and orderly mode of transition during the times of arrival and dismissal, please adhere to the following safety procedures:

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There will be staff members outside to assist everyone during the first week of school.

ARRIVAL:

Pre-K:

Students will go directly to their TCU. If a student is late, (after 8:35) the student must enter through the main entrance.

Grades 2-5:

Bused students will enter through the **main entrance**, go through security check, and proceed to the multipurpose room. Signs will be placed in the multipurpose room with homeroom numbers and teacher names for students to line up.

Students being dropped off by parents will enter through the **secondary front door**, go through security, and proceed to their designated homeroom area in the multipurpose room.

Grades 6-8:

All 6th-8th grade students will enter through the side gate to the left of the secondary front door. Teachers will be holding signs with their names and homeroom numbers – students should line up according to their homeroom. Teachers and students will then enter through the secondary front door, go through security, and proceed to their classrooms.

All students who come to school after 8:35 must report to the main entrance and receive a late pass.

DISMISSAL:

Bused students will meet in the bus route homerooms and wait until their bus is called. All other students will be picked up at the secondary entrance where they enter in the morning.

ARRIVAL:

All students whether bussed or dropped off will enter through the main entrance.

DISMISSAL:

All bussed students will meet in the gym and wait for their bus to be called. Students being picked up will be picked up at the cafeteria door on the right side of the building. Students **MUST** be signed out.

POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL INSTRUCTIONS

PowerSchool is an electronic management system that is utilized by the Elizabeth Public Schools in order to collect, store, and maintain pertinent student data and records. The application provides parents with real-time access to information that pertains to a student's schedule, attendance, grades, and academic progress; it also offers a convenient and accommodating way for both parents and teachers to communicate as needed. Therefore, everyone stays connected. Schedules for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year will be available to view on PowerSchool on **Thursday, August 29th**.

NEW AND RETURNING PARENTS TO EPS

Parents of new students must request a new account in order to input all of the information required to navigate the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Parents of existing students will need to log in, input, and update any changed information that has occurred for their child.

UNIFORM POLICY

The intended purpose for the EPS dress code is to promote a positive self-image and to enhance school pride amongst our students. ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Pre-K:

The implementation of iPads into the preschool classrooms provides an opportunity for our youngest students to extend their learning through developmentally appropriate active-learning experiences. While the iPad can serve as a tool to help reinforce skills in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics, it can also provide opportunities for preschool students to investigate, explore, and create within the early childhood setting.

The implementation of the iPad is integrated seamlessly into the preschool curriculum during center time. iPads enhance student learning by providing opportunities for students to retell and create their own stories, investigate and explore exciting new places and diverse cultures, capture their learning through student created portfolios, and reinforce skills through books and learning applications.

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K-8:

For the past few years, our school has operated as a 1:1 technology school; and as a result, all students will continue to utilize a *laptop computer* for their daily classroom instruction. Students should make every effort to take excellent care of their *laptops* throughout the school year, as this is a very special privilege. Our 1:1 technology implementation will continue to ensure that our students attain the competitive standards that are needed to foster both college and career readiness. *All students are required to bring their charged laptops and power cords to school daily.*

NEW ENTRANTS

All new students to the district will receive their laptop during the first week of school.

Through this system, parents are immediately alerted of urgent information, major events, and/or upcoming dates. IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Pre-K:

Please be advised that the State of New Jersey, Department of Health Services, has changed several immunization requirements. All children attending licensed childcare centers and preschools are required to receive an annual flu vaccination.

Please provide proof of your child's required immunization as soon as possible and **no later than December 20th, 2024**. Students who do not have the required documentation will be excluded from school as of **January 2nd, 2025**.

K-8:

The state of New Jersey has mandated that all children born after January 1st, 1997 and enrolled in Grade Six, **will be required to receive a booster dose of the diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis vaccine (Tdap) as well as one dose of meningococcal vaccine.** Documentation that

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your child has received the required sixth grade immunizations must be turned into the school nurse no later than **Friday, September 6th, 2024**.

Students entering 6th grade with birthdays on or after **Friday, September 6th, 2024** must provide written confirmation from your child's healthcare provider of the vaccination appointment. This appointment should be within two weeks of your child turning 11 years of age. The immunization record must be submitted immediately following the appointment. The Elizabeth Public School District is compelled by law to ensure that all students receive their required immunizations.

Children who do not meet immunization requirements or do not have documentation of a scheduled appointment within two weeks of turning 11 years of age will be excluded from school beginning the first school day.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation will be available for the following students:

- Elementary students who live more than 2.0 miles from their school
 - High school students who live more than 2.5 miles from their school
 - Students whose IEP include transportation services
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SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Teacher will notify students/parents/guardians of school supplies on the first day of school.
