The trips began more than a decade ago. For their participants, much like Rudolph, the program will go down in history.


Winter Spirit Week at School No. 2


Virtual Classroom Fieldtrip


Port Authority Halsey Graduate



AUTHORIZING ENTRY INTO A FIVE YEAR, FIVE MONTH LEASE AGREEMENT WITH SIGNATURE PUBLIC FUNDING FOR THE LEASE OF FIVE 54-SEAT SCHOOL BUSES

WHEREAS, the Board, at its regular meeting held on December 15, 2016, authorized the issuance of a request for bids pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law Joint Purchasing Authority to seek quotes of lease financing for five school buses; and

WHEREAS, a Request for Bids was initiated on December 27, 2016 with the aid of Hoffman's Crossing Campus/Lease Purchase Bidding Services through the Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Bid Opening was conducted on January 10, 2017 in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-4.5d which opening resulted in the submission of two (2) responses; and

WHEREAS, an evaluation report of the two bids was prepared by the Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission, a copy of which is attached hereto, recommending Signature Public Funding Corp., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Signature Bank as the lowest responsible bidder, to be approved as the leasing company for the financing of the lease of the five school buses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Elizabeth Board of Education, as follows:

- 1. The aforesaid recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.
- 2. **Signature Public Funding Corp.**, located at 75 Holly Hill Lane, Greenwich, Connecticut 06830 is deemed qualified to provide the lease financing necessary to lease five 54-seat school buses previously identified for acquisition.
- 3. The Board authorizes entry into a leasing agreement pursuant to the terms of the proposal and term sheet attached hereto and authorizes and directs the Board President and Board Secretary/School Business Administrator to execute a leasing agreement, upon approval of the terms of the same by the Board's general counsel, in normal fashion. The attached proposal provides for a lease term of five years at a lease rate of 2.04% with an initial payment of \$160,000.00 due on March 1, 2017 followed by five annual payments of \$48,426.10 commencing on August 1, 2017 and a final lease payment of \$160,286.25 due and payable on August 1, 2022.
- 4. All previous Resolutions and/or orders and directives of Board employees or officials which are contrary or inconsistent with the terms of this instant Resolution are hereby rescinded, repealed and otherwise deemed ineffectual to the extent of their inconsistency.
- 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
