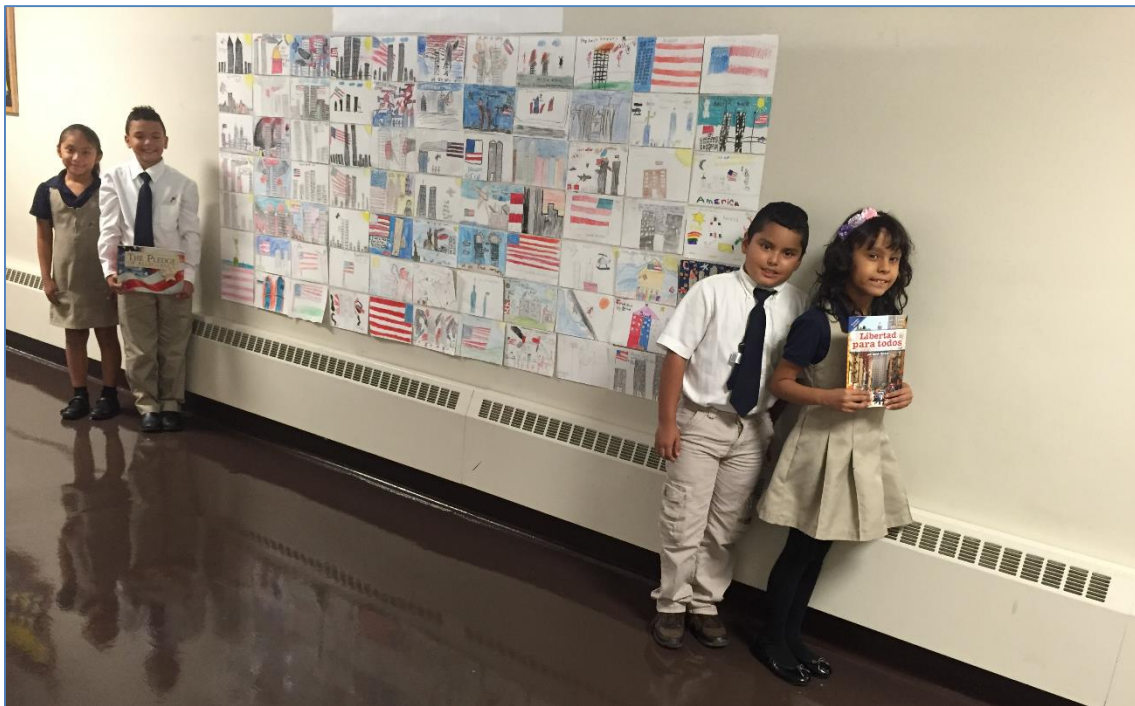
## Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

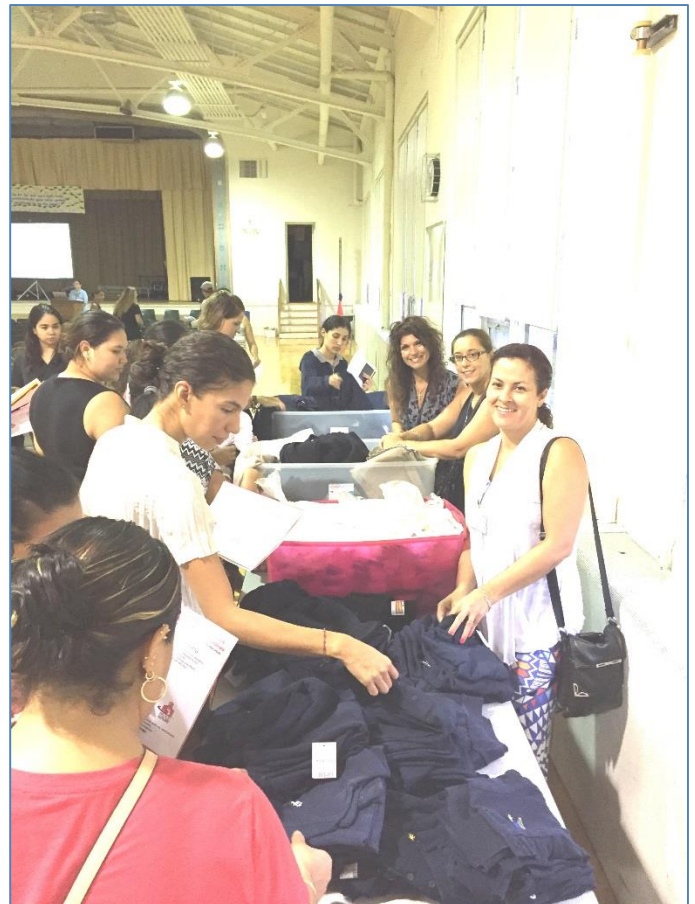
## Open House at School No. 16

The evening was broken down into sessions to provide parents with multiple children with the opportunity to visit each child's teacher.

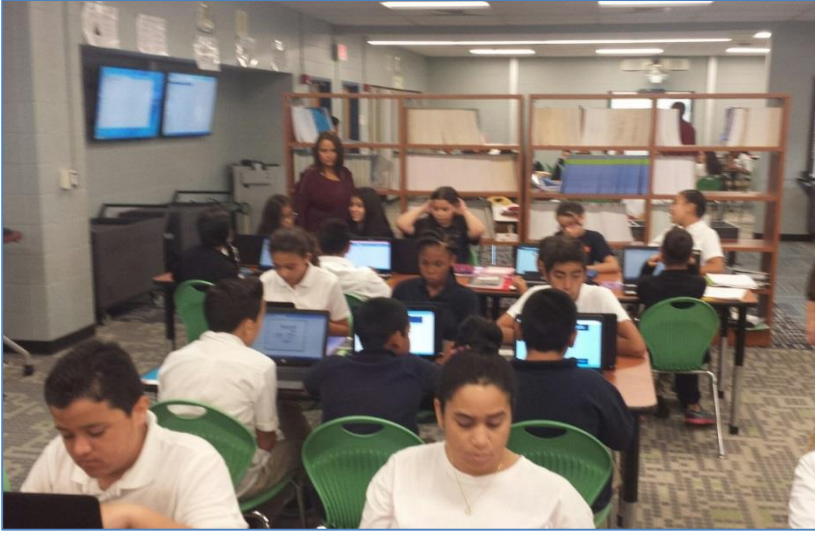

## Dwyer Tech Guidance Counselor Inducted into MSU Athletics Hall of Fame



John E. Dwyer Technology Academy guidance counselor Stephanie Gardner (Machin) was among five members recently inducted into the Montclair State University Department of Athletics Hall of Fame.

The five newest members comprise the 42nd class to be inducted, bringing the total number of members to 211. The group was officially enshrined on October 1 at an induction dinner held at the Valley Regency in Clifton, NJ. The group was also honored at halftime of the annual Homecoming football contest versus William Paterson University on October 3.



One of the all-time great players in the history of the MSU women's basketball program, Machin made an immediate impact for the Red Hawks earning NJAC Rookie of the Year honors in addition to landing a spot on the All-NJAC First-Team as a freshman after averaging 14.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. She just about duplicated that performance the next season earning those same awards along with being named to the Metropolitan Writers Division III All-Star Team.

In 2006, Machin was selected as the NJAC Player of the Year and garnered her third straight First-Team All-NJAC honor. She became the 14th player in program history to score 1,000 points as she ranked among the top 12 in five categories in the NJAC, including third in scoring at 13.4 points per game.

Machin became the first MSU player in 15 years to be named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Division III All-America Team.

Machin capped off her career in 2007 leading the Red Hawks to the ECAC Metro Championship. Named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament, Machin earned her fourth NJAC First-Team award and became just the second player to earn All-American accolades multiple times as she was named to the WBCA Team.

She finished her career near the top of the MSU all-time list in several statistical categories, including fifth in points (1,493), sixth in scoring average (14.0 ppg), fifth in field goals (570), second in field goal percentage (.491), fourth in free throws made (349), sixth in rebounds (806), and 11th in blocked shots (77).

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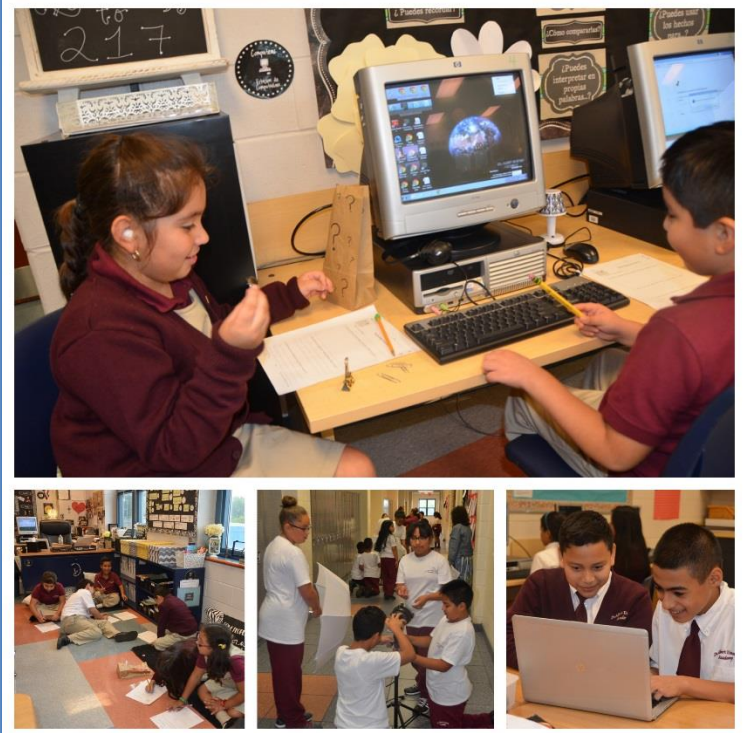


## Engineering in Elementary

**UNION COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SERVICES COMMISSION**  
**2015-2016 NONPUBLIC SECURITY AID PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS** P.L. 2015. C.63, requires the State and local community purchase nonpublic security aid program upon individual request to all students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through 12 in nonpublic schools located within the local school district. From the amount appropriated for Nonpublic Security Aid, the Commissioner of Education shall provide State aid to each school district in an amount to equal \$25 multiplied by the number of nonpublic school students within the district identified by the district on or before November 5 for security services, equipment or technology to ensure a safe and secure school environment for nonpublic school students.

**WHEREAS** the Union County Educational Services Commission has agreed to handle the purchasing and processing of nonpublic school security aid program, security services, equipment or technology for local public school districts for the purpose of greater cost effectiveness through joint purchasing and centralized administration,

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Elizabeth Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Union County Educational Services Commission whereby the Commission will administer a nonpublic security aid program for those eligible students attending nonpublic schools located within its district for the 2015-2016 school year, in accordance with P.L. 2015. C.63; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Elizabeth Board of Education pay a surcharge equal to 12% of the allocation for nonpublic school security to cover the Commission's costs for administering the program. The Commission will bill the district for services rendered throughout the 2015-2016 school year.

**Title:**                   **Military Education Coordinator**

**Position Summary:**

The Elizabeth Public Schools would like to offer JROTC programs supported by the Navy, Army, Air Force in addition to the Marines.

The JROTC program provides a four-year, sequential program of instruction that emphasizes academic preparation, citizenship, leadership, character development, and the scope and nature of the particular military service branch.

The intent is to make these program options available to all students in grades 9-12 who want to take advantage of a student transfer to enroll in the program. The specific military branch contracts with the individual school and the school system to offer these programs.

The Military Education Coordinator (MEC) is responsible for the outreach efforts and school community development. Occasional evening and weekend hours and travel to other regional offices are required.

**Specific Responsibilities Include:**

- 1 Provide outreach initiatives to attain district goals towards program implementation, enrollment and retention.
- 2 Create, coordinate, and provide consistent outreach services to specific military and local events.
- 3 Create and maintain an outreach plan for the site to ensure student retention.
- 4 Establish, maintain and build positive working relationships with the military education centers.
- 5 Maintain an active presence by attending functions, and education activities which include college/education fairs.
