SCHOOL PROFILE 2024-2025

In September 2009, Thomas A. Edison Career and Technical Academy (TECTA) opened as one of 7 academies in the Elizabeth Public School District. Students attending TECTA are provided with a rigorous academic course sequence which includes 4 years of English, 4 years of Physical Education/Health, 3 years of Mathematics, 3 years of Science, 3 years of Social Studies, 3 years of a career strand, 1 year of World Language, 1 year of Visual Arts, and a course in Personal Finance Literacy. While our students obtain a diploma from the Elizabeth Public Schools, our students are ranked within their own graduating class of TECTA.

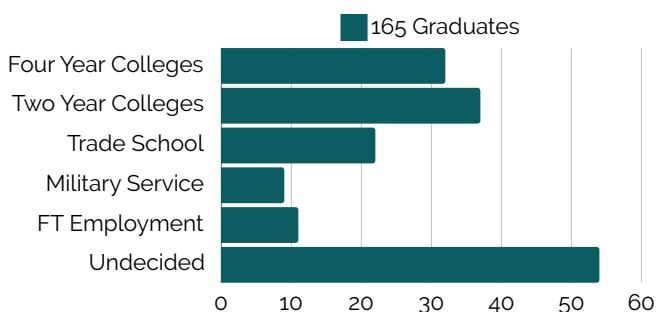
