DWYER SENIOR RECEIVES FULL SCHOLARSHIP THROUGH QUESTBRIDGE



John E. Dwyer Technology Academy senior Kamylah Clayton has been awarded a full scholarship to the University of Notre Dame through the 2024 QuestBridge National College Match, a national program that connects high-achieving high school seniors from low-income backgrounds with full four-year scholarships to 52 of the nation's top colleges.

Clayton was among 2,627 seniors of the Class of 2025 from throughout the nation who were recognized as Match Scholarship Recipients. The process included the selection of 7,288 finalists among more than 25,500 applicants to be considered for the QuestBridge National College Match Scholarship.

She is currently the No. 1 ranked student of Dwyer Technology Academy's Class of 2025 with a 4.8 GPA and has earned the AP® Scholar with Honor Award from College Board by attaining an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken and scores of three or higher on four or more exams.


EPS PARTNERS WITH NEW JERSEY STATE POLICE FOR NEW JERSEY DRIVE/TEEN DRIVER PROGRAM





The Elizabeth Public Schools Physical Education department participated in the New Jersey State Police NJ Drive event. The New Jersey State Police (NJSP) New Jersey Drive/Teen Driver Program is an interactive program that educates teens about the dangers of driving under the influence (DUI/DWI). The program consists of a classroom presentation, a practical exercise using golf carts and Fatal Vision goggles to simulate the effects of alcohol on vision and reaction time while operating a vehicle, and instruction on the Graduate Drivers License (GDL) process. Twelfth grade students who successfully completed their tenth-grade driver education course, and have a student driver permit, were selected by their driver ed instructors from each school to attend.
