

J. Christian Bollwage Finance Academy's NAF Academy of Finance has been recognized as a Model/Distinguished status academy by NAF for the eighth year in a row. Each year, NAF academies are evaluated through a rigorous process to ensure the highest level of support to students. Schools are scored in four major categories, including Academy Development and Structure, Advisory Board, Program of Study (Curriculum and Instruction), and Work-Based Learning. The scores earned for each of those categories are combined to produce an overall score for the school. The Model/Distinguished status, achieved by both Bollwage Finance Academy's NAF Academy of Finance and John E. HAMILTON PREPARATORY ACADEMY ALUMNUS NAMED GOVERNOR'S STEM SCHOLAR





Alexander Hamilton Preparatory Academy Alumnus Joseph David Quinn-Vitabile was one of 111 high school and college students from all of New Jersey's 21 counties to be selected as a Governor's STEM Scholar for 2025.

Quinn-Vitabile is a third-year computer science major and physics minor at Montclair State University. He recently interned at Johnson & Johnson Technology Services in the areas of reliability operations and cloud computing, where he developed software tools for Application Maintenance Leadership and an infrastructure-provisioning automation for Amazon Web Services managed databases.


Governor's STEM Scholars (GSS) is a public-private partnership between the Research & Development Council of New Jersey, the Office of the Governor, the New Jersey Department of Education, the New Jersey Secretary of Higher Education, and public and private research institutions. GSS works to sustain and strengthen New Jersey's STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) talent pipeline by introducing the state's STEM students to the R&D and STEM ecosystem.



ELIZABETH ATHLETICS CELEBRATES 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF COUNTY AND STATE CHAMPION 1984 AND 1985 MINUTEMEN BOYS BASKETBALL TEAMS



On January 11, Elizabeth Athletics honored the 1984 and 1985 Minutemen basketball teams on the 40th anniversary of their respective county and state championship runs. The 1984 team won the Union County Tournament with a 57-42 victory over Plainfield and the 1985 team won the Union County Championship with a 70-56 victory over Rahway as well as the Group 4 state championship with a victory over Camden. Both teams were guided by NJSIAA Hall of Fame coach Ben Candelino during his first two seasons as coach of the Minutemen. The Minutemen would win 9 Union County Tournaments, seven North 2, Group 4 state sectional titles, 5 Group 4 championships, and one Tournament of Champions title in 1990 with a 65-62 victory over St. Anthony's during Coach Candelino's tenure.
