




SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM ESL Point of Entry Program



CTE Afterschool Tutoring Program




CTE Saturday Program

14 EPS SCHOOLS RECEIVE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL GOLD AWARD



Fourteen schools within Elizabeth Public Schools received a gold designation from the New Jersey Safe Routes to School (SRTS) in 2024 as part of the organization's recognition program. SRTS enables and encourages safer and more accessible walking and bicycling environments for children in New Jersey through education, training, and research. School Nos. 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 19, 21, 22, 26, 27, 29, 30, and 51, along with Edison Career and Technical Academy, were gold award recipients. School Nos. 1 and 13 received this year's bronze award while School Nos. 5 and 14, as well as Hamilton Preparatory Academy, received the first steps award.

EHS BOYS SOCCER COACH GONZALES EARNS CAREER WIN NO. 100



Elizabeth High School Boys Soccer Coach Jacques Gonzales earned his 100th career win with a 4-1 victory by the No. 18 Minutemen over Cranford at Williams Field in Elizabeth on September 30.

Gonzales has reached the 100-win mark in only six plus seasons, including the shortened 2020 season, and his teams have lost more than 4 games in a season only once, going 100-21-12 with him at the helm. Several Elizabeth players have earned postseason recognitions during his tenure, including all-state, all-group, and all-conference.

Elizabeth started the season by winning its first six games and is currently ranked No. 20 in the state following the 4-1 victory over Cranford.


CICARELL, HAMILTON, DYWER ACADEMIES MAKE AP HONOR ROLL

Elizabeth High School – Frank J. Cicarell Academy (EHS – FJC), Alexander Hamilton Preparatory Academy, and John E. Dwyer Technology Academy once again were among New Jersey's schools to earn a place on the College Board 2024 AP School Honor Roll. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools at Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Platinum tiers for meeting or exceed the criteria of three data metrics, including college culture, college credit, and college optimization. EHS-FJC received the Platinum tier, while Dwyer Technology Academy and Hamilton Preparatory Academy received Bronze tier though both earned gold status in the college culture subcategory.

EHS MARCHING BAND TAKES 1ST PLACE AT MET LIFE STADIUM



The Elizabeth High School Marching Band competed this weekend at Met Life Stadium as part of the Ludwig Musser Classic USBands Competition. The marching band scored an 89.5 in their performance, earning first place over Hillsborough High School and South Brunswick High School who are both known to have great music programs.
