BOARD OF EDUCATION (Official)

January 17, 2013 Elizabeth, New Jersey

The regular meeting of the Board of Education was called on January 17, 2013 at 7:00 p.m., in the Multi Purpose Room, Donald Stewart Center for Early Childhood Education, 544 Pennsylvania Avenue, Elizabeth, New Jersey.

Board President Tony Monteiro presented the following statement at 7:25 p.m.

"Ladies and Gentlemen, good evening. This is a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Education. Pursuant to New Jersey Statutes and the rules adopted by the Board of Education, notice of this meeting was sent to Worrall Community Newspapers, The Star Ledger and Cablevision of Elizabeth on Friday, January 11, 2013. In addition, this notice is posted on the Bulletin Board in the lobby of 500 North Broad Street, and pursuant to this act, a copy has been filed with the City Clerk of Elizabeth."

"I wish to extend a warm welcome to everyone present and to our television viewers to this January 17, 2013 meeting of the Board of Education. We are here to govern, provide management oversight, and make policy for the district. The Superintendent manages the district. This is a meeting of the Board in public, not a meeting of the public."

"This meeting is being recorded and will become part of the Elizabeth Board of Education permanent record. In order that the recording will adequately reflect the proceedings, please refrain from talking while others are speaking. I also ask that you silence the sound on your electronic devices. Since it is legally mandated that these proceedings be accurately recorded, I may have to ask for order periodically should noise begin to interfere with our recording capabilities. I am pleased that you have taken time this evening to join us. Thank you for your interest in the Elizabeth Public Schools."

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Pablo Muñoz stated that his first report is on the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools accreditation which is among the premier accrediting associations in the world and pioneered the accreditation of colleges and schools in the United States more than a century ago. Mr. Muñoz stated that the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools is celebrating its 125th Anniversary and remains a prestigious validation of educational excellence and dynamic school improvement in traditional and nontraditional schools worldwide. Mr. Muñoz stated that the accreditation is an impartial third party validation that educational institutions meet challenging but achievable standards of quality and provides a mechanism for continuous school improvement. Mr. Muñoz stated that it is a dynamic process which requires a commitment and involvement of a wide range of stakeholders and engages the community and ultimately assures the public of an organization's integrity.

Mr. Muñoz stated that our six high schools are going through this accreditation process. Mr. Muñoz stated that he is pleased to announce that last school year two of our high schools went through the accreditation process and both of the high schools, Elizabeth High School and Thomas A. Edison Career and Technical Academy, received accreditation from the Middle States. Mr. Muñoz stated that he is also pleased to announce that two more high schools have

gone through the accreditation process, Thomas Jefferson Arts Academy in December and Alexander Hamilton Preparatory Academy this past week. Mr. Muñoz stated that both schools were evaluated by the Middle States Accreditation Committee and received an oral report on the last day of the visit and both schools are being recommended to the association for accreditation. Mr. Muñoz stated that the last two schools to go through this process are John E. Dwyer Technology Academy which is scheduled to be evaluated in February and Admiral William F. Halsey, Jr. Leadership Academy which is scheduled to be evaluated the end of April. Mr. Muñoz congratulated Elizabeth High School, Thomas A. Edison Career and Technical Academy, Thomas Jefferson Arts Academy, and Alexander Hamilton Preparatory Academy.

Superintendent Muñoz stated that his second report is the excellence news. Mr. Muñoz highlighted the excellent news and activities that have occurred in the Elizabeth Public Schools since our last board meeting including the Marshall C. Reilly School No. 7. seventh and eighth grade AVID students from Toussaint L'Ouverture-Marquis de Lafayette School No. 6 toured William Paterson University, students in the Culinary Arts Program at Thomas A. Mr. Monteiro stated that on Wednesday, January 23, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. at the Dunn Sports Center we will be celebrating the Night of Champions recognizing the State Championship Football Team, National Championship Marching Band and Cheerleading Team for achieving state and national recognition and invited everyone to attend.

Mr. Monteiro presented the following public participation statement.

"At this time, the microphones are open for public comment to those who have signed in prior to this session. I shall call individuals to the microphones based on the order of the sign-in. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three minutes in duration. The total time of public comment shall be limited to sixty minutes. No individual is able to yield their time to another individual. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no participant may address or question Board members individually. The following rules for public participants shall apply: time limits will be strictly enforced, no personal attacks on individuals, no vulgar or indecent language, a person may address the Board no more than once during a single meeting, speakers should refrain from naming individuals, and comments or questions posed during public participation will not be debated. As a reminder, this is a meeting of the Board in public, not a meeting of the public."

Mr. Monteiro called upon the first public participant, Jose Rodriguez, to address the Board.

Jose Rodriguez, 618 Jackson Avenue, stated that the district does not have a specialized school dedicated to special education, that one out of ten students in our schools are classified and almost 300 students are sent out of district. Mr. Rodriguez stated that this is an idea that came up and it would be good to talk about this with the community involved and perhaps start a dialogue in the future.

Mr. Monteiro thanked him for his comments and called upon the next participant, Amanda Leon, to address the Board.

Amanda Leon, 19 Erie Street, stated that she is a member of the Elizabeth Education Organizing Committee and they have given petitions with 774 signatures and tonight they are presenting petitions with additional signatures. Ms. Leon stated that the petition states that they would like the response time to be before 7:30 before the business and the awards on another night.

Mr. Monteiro thanked her for her comments and called upon the next participant, Maria Echavarria, to address the Board.

Maria Echavarria, 321 Westfield Avenue, stated that she has two children with special needs, that there are schools with multi-disabilities and the parents should have the right to choose.

Mr. Monteiro thanked her for her comments.

Since there were no other citizens signed in to address the Board, Mr. Monteiro declared this portion of the public meeting closed.

Mrs. Castillo-Ospina stated that it would be wonderful if we had a specialized school for special needs students but that is segregation and that we are mandated by the Department of Education to have inclusion. Mrs. Castillo-Ospina stated that every child is entitled to an education and explained there are a lot of things that need to be considered when children are sent out of district because the district cannot accommodate the needs of the child.

Mr. Trujillo thanked his colleagues for working with the administration to make the Night of Champions a possibility. Mr. Trujillo stated that the State and this City have been through a lot with the effects of the storm and the economy and it is hard to find a highlight in the day. Mr. Trujillo stated that it is good to see that we can celebrate our success, not only academically but also in sports. Mr. Trujillo stated that the football game was an incredible game and really brought the City together and so many people came out to support our young men on the field that day. Mr. Trujillo thanked all the parents who support the marching band, traveling with them, chaperoning, and carrying the equipment and that it is a lot of sacrifice and commitment and that is what brings the results. Mr. Trujillo stated that it is a big deal and encouraged everyone to come to Dunn Sports Center on Wednesday night and support our kids.

Mr. Trujillo stated that he is blessed to have two healthy children and gives thanks to God everyday. Mr. Truiillo stated that he has the opportunity to advocate on behalf of the parents of the children who do have to have the challenge of special education everyday and his heart goes out to them. Mr. Trujillo stated that this administration and this school district is committed to making sure that every child gets a fair free public education. Mr. Trujillo stated that unfortunately many of these challenges are great and it takes time and a lot of resources and he does not care what it costs to educate our children. Mr. Trujillo stated that if we can fight a war across the world and build another nation we should be able to have enough money to educate our children here. Mr. Trujillo stated that he will support any dollar spent towards education any day especially in special education. Mr. Trujillo stated that we have an incredible amount of professionals here in the district who do enormous work everyday. Mr. Trujillo stated that he doesn't know if public hearings or public forums are the method to resolve the issues because a lot of time these are private issues, these are issues the parents don't want to discuss in public, that it is best left to the professionals. Mr. Trujillo stated that we do contract with several facilities throughout the state to make sure our children are getting the best and what we can't provide for them here we go out and get it. Mr. Trujillo stated that his experience has been that the parents will let you know if that is what they want for their children and every case is unique. Mr. Trujillo stated that to generalize and have one building where all this is going to take place, he can't see that being the answer even if it was plausible. Mr. Trujillo stated that he does not want to politicize it, that it is a very sensitive issue and a very emotional situation for many people. Mr. Trujillo stated that he will support and his colleagues will support him in saying that when it comes to educating our children, all our children including our special needs children, money shouldn't be the issue.

Mr. González stated that there is something going on in Trenton that has a great deal of impact on education in our City and is titled the Educational Adequacy Report and is currently being reviewed in Trenton. Mr. González stated that it has a nice sounding name but the result is to decrease the funding weight directed at low-income and limited English speaking students. Mr. González stated that he is impressed with the efforts of a group, Save Our Schools NJ, along with others that have taken the lead to make certain that the upcoming state budget doesn't shortchange our aid and are opposing, as should all of us, any measure of underfunding. Mr. González stated that our district continues to make great strides with improved test scores and the educational quality we provide and there is no time to go backwards. Mr. González stated that we will continue to watch this matter and report to you to make sure that our children are not shortchanged by the powers to be in Trenton.

Ms. Bathelus stated that the Building Future Leaders Program, which is a high school program for teens between the ages of 14 and 18, is having the first Step Competition tomorrow at School No. 23. Ms. Bathelus stated that the doors open at 5:00 p.m., showtime is at 6:00 p.m. and it is free. Ms. Bathelus invited everyone to attend to support our young teenagers from the City.

Mr. Monteiro thanked everyone for coming and participating in the Elizabeth Board of Education process and stated that it is so important for our district to have input from the Board, as well as from the members of the public, parents, and the staff. Mr. Monteiro announced that for the next couple of months the Board of Education meetings are going to be held throughout the City of Elizabeth so we can be exposed to all the communities in the City for people who may have difficulties in transportation and traveling and to have them be part of this meeting. Mr. Monteiro stated that with the cooperation of the Board and the Superintendent we look to being in a different location for the next month's meeting and then thereafter.
